



# Karen Saleen



Karen is an artist using the colored pencil medium, who grew up in Southern California, but has called Salem and the Willamette Valley home for more than 40 years. An interest in photography developed into using colored pencil to hand-color photographs since 2005.


While photography is still an interest, many of her photos are now the references for colored her colored pencil art. Since retirement in 2013 she has been seriously creating art using colored pencil. Though primarily self-taught, she has taken classes in the visual arts, colored pencil drawing and art history throughout her lifetime.

With retirement came time to pursue active involvement in art-related organizations and the Salem-Keizer art community. She became a member of the Colored Pencil Society of

America (CPSA) in 203 and belongs to the Oregon and Washington chapters. She is the former District Chapter Development Director for the governing board of CPSA. Karen is on the Keizer Art Association (KAA) governing board where she serves as the Gallery Host and First Tuesday Meet-Up Coordinators.

Karen has had her artwork selected to be in the CP Hidden Treasures Volumes 4 & 5 and in the March 2018 issue of Color Magazine. Her piece "Tea Party Fashion Statement" won an honorable mention at the 2018 Oregon State Fair, proving, once again, that colored pencil is fine art. As a result of that showing, she was approached by Salem Art Association (SAA) to mentor high school students who had an interest in developing their colored pencil skills.

More recently, she won a coveted First Place at KAA for her piece entitled "Lion of the Sea" and the PanPastel award for Distinction in the 2020 CPSA Explore This! Exhibition for her piece, "Chaotic Aquarium". In 2023 her piece "A Meeting of Great Minds" was selected as Best of Show for the 31st Annual Colored Pencil Exhibition hosted by CPSA DC 201-Portland.

Karen and her husband, Bill, had been a part of KAA for many years and both of them displayed their art, many times winning awards, in our gallery. Over the years, Karen had told us of Bill's very serious accident that resulted in a traumatic brain injury and that art therapy had played an important part in his recovery process. Sadly, Bill has passed on, but his story continues. For our First Tuesday Meet-Up program Karen outlined Bill's accident and the initial progress that he had made in healing his body, but the doctors were not hopeful for a full recovery. Karen knew Bill better than that; she knew that he was capable of much more than the doctors thought possible. Karen is an artist specializing in photography and watercolor AND she had a friend who taught art. Between the two of them they encouraged a reluctant Bill to start to draw. What followed was very close to miraculous! Not only was Bill making strides in his art as Karen showed us, but in other areas of his life; best of all was the return of his humor! If you missed this program, you missed a gem. Our First Tuesday Meet-Up programs have been wonderful this year and a feather in the cap of Keizer Art Association.

### **CALL TO ARTISTS**

The Keizer Art Association, in partnership with the Keizer Area Chamber of Commerce, invites you to participate in the first annual Riverwalk Art Fair.

This event coincides with the long-standing KeizerFest in the lovely Keizer Rapids Park. Artist vendor spaces will be along the shaded and paved walk by the Willamette River, which is a short walk from what will be the hustle and bustle of KeizerFest..

The fair is on August 9, 10 and 11, 2024, Set up is on August 8, 2024 – 3 to 7 pm. Hours on Friday and Saturday are from 10 am to 6 pm and Sunday hours are from 10 am to 3 pm. There will be 24-hour security provided. NO commission on sales!


