This show has been a big hit! We look forward to the website being filled with many different fish and animals...lots of fins, feathers and fur.


Children ages 4 – 14 are encouraged to enter this show.


INTAKE is Wednesday, January 4th from 3 to 6 pm in the KAA Gallery.

2D First place: "Chilly December Mornina". pastel, Debbie Bowen; "A stunning portrait of a rosy cheeked youngster rendered softly in pastel. There are a variety of textures; one can almost feel the ribs of his stocking cap, his skin appears to be velvety and the woodgrain in the background is amazing. Between his beautiful smile and the gleam in his eye, one can tell that he is, indeed, one happy camper!"

- 2D Second place: "Ride Like the Wind", pyrography, Don White; "This piece evokes the feeling of a little girl that, while riding a carousel horse, dreams of riding that real horse, someday! Her hair and shirt are blowing in the wind, just like on a real horse and she's determined to win that "race", played only in her imagination. Done in pyrography, there are wonderful shadows, texture and movement achieved with the woodburning tool."

- 2D Third place: "Snipit of Lace", dry point intaglio print, Linda Chatfield; "This is a tiny piece and might be easily overlooked, but take the time to look at and study it. Done in a monochromatic print technique it is very delicate and every line looks to be precise. There's a balance of tonal ranges and wide variety of shapes that make up this snippet of lace. There's a strong, path-like vertical element, but there are many shapes that drift off the path and keep the eye moving throughout the piece. A lovely, delicate composition."

- **Photography First place:** "Spray", John DeJarnatt; "It's a well-balanced composition with an even distribution of highlights in the spray and ocean turbulence and deep ocean blue. The action in this piece is phenomenal! One's eye is first drawn to the spray of the water from this wave, which we see the spray is drifting to the right, but we follow it to the left and find the surfer that is traveling off to the left just ahead of the curl of the wave. Everything in this part of the frame is suggesting movement and action: the spray, wave and surfer".

Photography Second place:
"Saddle", Janice Christman; "An
interesting composition, the lime
green wall color pulls the viewer's
eye to the upper left, but the stirrup
of the saddle is a nice diagonal that
directs the eye to the bottom right.
There's a great balance of tonal
ranges and a nice contrast is the
use of the contemporary lime green
color juxtaposed on the vintage
saddle. The close-up view and
striking color give the piece an
almost abstract quality."

• Third place: "Cloud Forest", Karen Aiello; "The striking colors found in this piece are what immediately draw the eye into this photo, but structures in the composition lead the eye in other directions throughout: the tree in the foreground is offset to the left as the branches point to the water. The strong diagonals in the foreground and midground help to move the eye throughout the composition. The blue reflections of the water pull you deeper into the woods." --Karen Saleen



Juror's Merit Award, "Shadows on the Snow", watercolor, Michelle Myers; "A great storytelling scene: One can imagine the quiet afternoon setting where not even the flow of water can be heard. There is no one else in the scene, it is quiet and serene. It must be an early snow, as it is not deep and there are leaves still on the trees in the foreground. The deep shadows are painted on the snow like a patchwork blanket, keeping all beneath it safe and snug. This scene has an interesting use of intersecting diagonals which keep the eye moving throughout the image with the shadows on the snow pointing to the left, directly at the trees in the foreground and the river bed diagonal moving one's eye to the right, passed the bridge and towards the background trees; a lovely composition."

Best of Show, "Itsy Bitsy Spider", watercolor, Nola Pear; "A wonderful watercolor experience. The whimsical spider appears tucked into its delicate web as it surveys the meadow, its spent flowers and resulting seed heads. Those same seed heads are placed on the diagonal and help to move the eye up and over to our spider web or down to the mysterious marbling. Marbling gives the piece a sense of movement and mystery as we tread deeper into the meadow, but the poppy seed-heads and the itsy, bitsy spider bring us back to reality."

This class is designed for intermediate to experienced carvers and will focus on pattern transfer, roughout, carving details, and finishing.

All materials will e supplied by the instructor Student only need to brng their carving tools and imaginations.

If you are a beginning carver and would like to participate in this class, you are welcome to do so. Capitol Woodcarvers will supply basic tools for use during class. Please do note that beginners may not be able to keep up with the pace of the instruction. Even so, you will learn concepts and processes to allow you to complete the project at home.

Drawing I and II Instructor, Laura Singer Beginner and Intermediate (Advanced Students Welcome) January 11, 18, 25 and February 1 Wednesdays, 2 to 4:30 pm \$60 for the four sessions, \$25 kit fee (optional) paid directly to instructor

These fun workshops are the perfect fit for anyone who is new to drawing, artists who struggle to freehand their designs, or advanced artists who want to improve their technique. Laura will walk through examples, give demonstrations, and show you how to start and complete a drawing project of your own. Learn core observational drawing techniques to produce accurate representations of your chosen subject. Students will have the option of choosing a beginning (easier) subject or a more advanced subject to practice techniques at their level.

The class will cover techniques in line and proportion; light, form, and shading; composition and perspective; and texture. You'll learn how to use your drawing materials, how to choose and light your subject, and most importantly, how to observe and see like an artist. Each workshop provides lots of time to work on a project with one-on-one feedback from the instructor.

Bring you own materials (see materials list online), or purchase a kit that has everything you need for all four sessions.

EXPLORING SCRATCHBOARD ART INSTRUCTOR, LAURA SINGER All Levels of Experience Saturday, March 18, 10 am – 2 pm \$55, includes all materials

Learn all about and try your hand at scratchboard in this one-day workshop. Scratchboard is a smooth, white clay board covered in a layer of black India ink. You draw by scratching or scraping away the ink to reveal the white underneath. It's like drawing, but in reverse. Add color with fastdraying scratchboard inks if you wish, then scratch again to reveal highlights. It's easy and it is very fun!

This workshop will cover how to select or prep your own scratchboard surface, what materials are handy to have and where to get them, different Techniques for scratching, how to add color with ink, and how to seal your final scratchboard to protect it. All materials are provided by the instructor, including helpful handouts, a scratchboard for practice, tools for scratching, and one 8 x 8-inch scratchboard for a finished piece. Instructor will have subject reference photos available to choose from, or bring your own inspiration (about 8 x 8 inches). No previous drawing experience is necessary.

We'll break for a half hour around noon, so bring your lunch.

COLOR THEORY: SCIENCE AND ART

Instructor, Laura Singer All Levels of Experience Saturdays, February 11 and 18, 10 am to 2 pm \$50

Learn all about color theory in this two-day workshop designed for artists and designers of all mediums. Students will explore a little of the history and the science behind color as well as the artistic principles of creating and using effective color palettes. We'll dive into what makes color, well, colorful.

T his workshop will cover how to create inspiring color palettes that tell a story, how to mix pigments to create a rainbow of colors, and why certain colors work well as primary colors in a palette. By means of demonstrations and hands-on exercises, students will examine the color wheel of both additive and subtractive color systems, and students will work on a colorful art piece.
