
Children ages 4 to 14 are encouraged to enter this show.



Penholders: a regular one works fine, but an oblique holder is my preference - this is the holder with a 'sidecar' which is very helpful if you are a fan of very sloping writing. Ink: walnut ink works well; if you are using an oblique holder you will need a small container to hold the ink as the 'sidecar' won't fit into most ink bottles. 


