

ARTIST OF THE MONTH CAROL HARRIS



Born in Baker, Oregon, Carol went to OSU and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Education and Art and a Master's in Education at WOU with a specialization in Extreme Learning Problems in Children. After settling in Salem and finding a teaching job, she married Keith, had a daughter, Jennifer, and taught Grades K-5 for 31 years and then worked at the Oregon State Prison in Salem for two years with young inmates in the GED program.

The Harris' became a farming family and grew cherries, pears and apples and then grass hay for horses. During 40 years of marriage she and Keith skied in the winter and sailed in the summer. When daughter, Jennifer,

became interested in horses, Carol acquired a large 4-H Horse Club where she is still a 4-H Leader and Polk County 4-H Horse Superintendent. Carol's interests are family, art, traveling, gardening, horses, dogs and volunteering. Most of all she loves being with her grandkids, Ben and Addy.

Carol says, "I have loved art since I was a little kid smelling a coffee can full of crayons sitting in the sun. I spent my life drawing with crayons and markers, making paper dolls, cutting, gluing, using pen and ink, photo retouching, creating the latest fashions, sculpting, crafting, architectural rendering, charcoal, pottery, acrylics, pastels, oils, watercolors, calligraphy and then along came Colored Pencils! An art tool such as these lowly little wood sticks with color inside allowed me to refine my art, pay attention to detail, apply layer upon layer to achieve a richness with depth and then still find more ways to push color around on a variety of papers."

Working with colored pencils requires patience and time. It takes a certain personality and determination to lay down color with colored pencils, blend, and shade, and do it again. The effects achieved are like no other medium in richness, velvety texture and depth. Becoming a member of Keizer Art Association has enriched my artistic endeavors and friendships. We all talk the same language.

EXPLORING SCRATCHBOARD ART

INSTRUCTOR. LAURA SINGER All Levels of Experience Saturday, March 18, 10 am - 2 pm \$55, includes all materials





Learn all about and try your hand at scratchboard in this one-day workshop. Scratchboard is a smooth, white clay board covered in a layer of black India ink. You draw by scratching or scraping away the ink to reveal the white underneath. It's like drawing, but in reverse. Add color with fast-draying scratchboard inks if you wish, then scratch again to reveal highlights. It's easy and it is very fun!

This workshop will cover how to select or prep your own scratchboard surface, what materials are handy to have and where to get them, different techniques for scratching, how to add color with ink, and how to seal your final scratchboard to protect it. All materials are provided by the instructor, including helpful handouts, a scratchboard for practice, tools for scratching, and one 8 x 8-inch scratchboard for a finished piece. Instructor will have subject reference photos available to choose from, or bring your own inspiration (about 8 x 8 inches). No previous drawing experience is necessary. We'll break for a half hour around noon, so bring your lunch.

Students must sign up for this class no later than one week before class begins.
