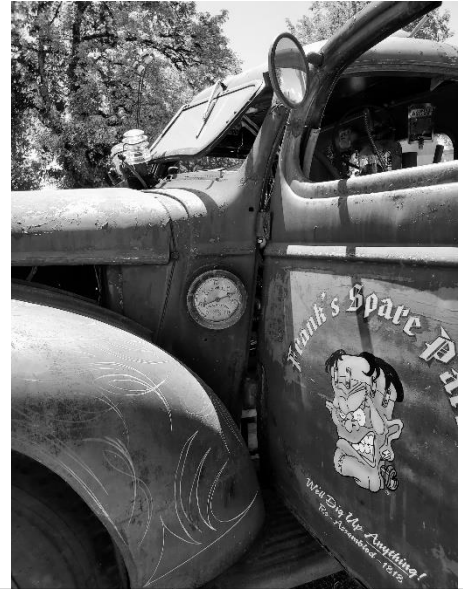

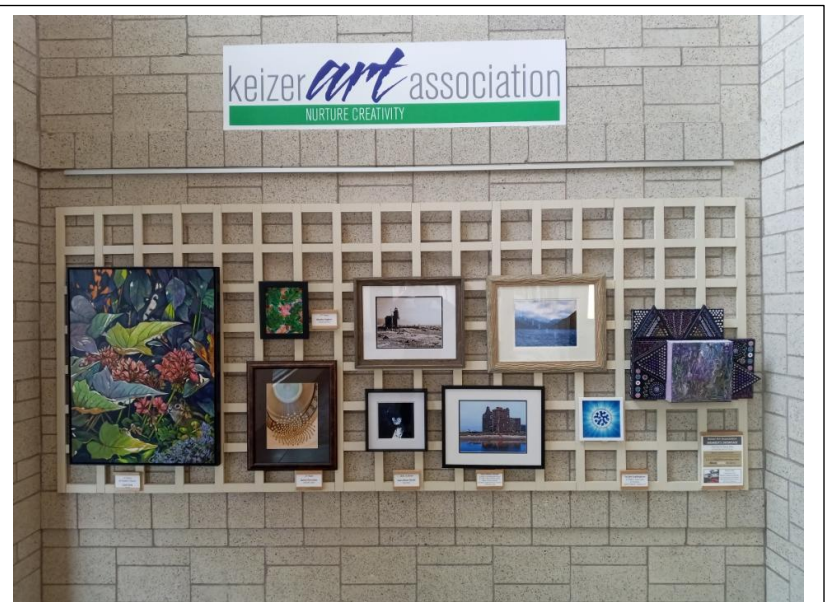

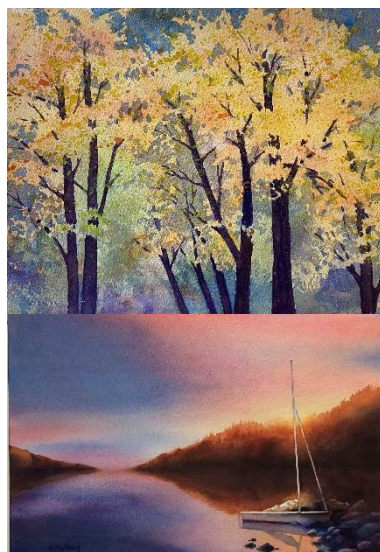


CREATING WITH ACRYLICS 1

Carol Sims says: Subjects from nature are my favorite things to paint. A design background influences my visions of the botanical world to create color-saturated compositions that celebrate the textures, forms, patterns and beauty of plants, flowers and serene settings.

Each week we will focus on specific novelties and varieties of acrylics, mediums and techniques----using photos, (your own), painting gradations, blending, light sources, scumbling, glazing and varnishing (why and how). We'll also paint from objects set up to practice form, depth and color combinations.

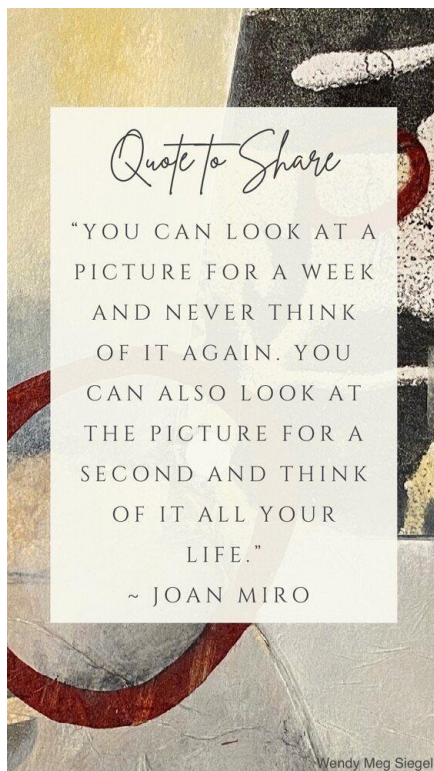


BEE FRAKTUR – INNOVATIVE PENCIL CLASS
