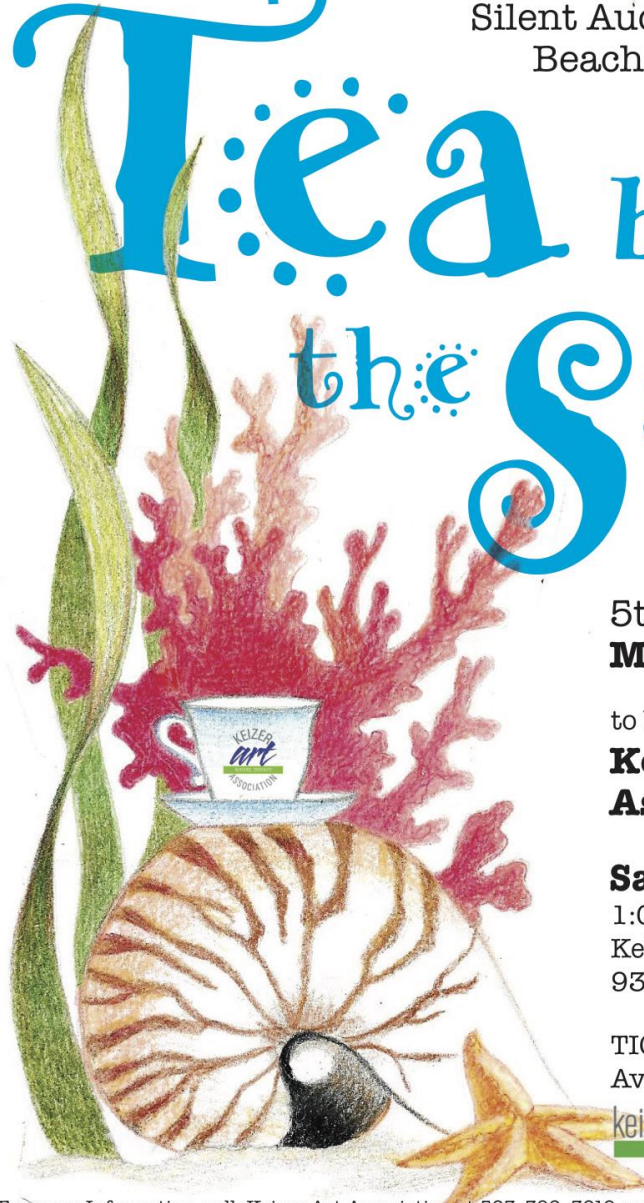

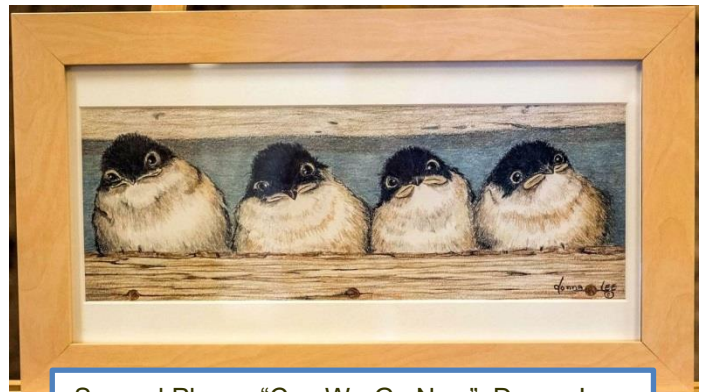

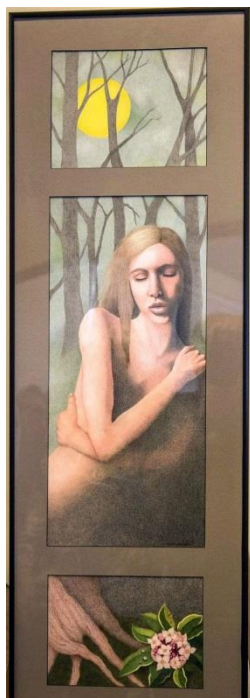

April 2 - May 21 - COLORED PENCIL CLASS taught by accomplished colored pencil artists. Always interesting, always something new and always fun. This class has been ongoing for a number of years and is welcome to beginners through advanced students interested in the wonderful and versatile world of colored pencils. Spring term will concentrate on substrates, blending, the color wheel, pictures without backgrounds and more. If you can sharpen a pencil, push it around on paper and love color, you are qualified to attend. Mondays, 9 am – 12 noon, \$70/8 weeks.

Supply List - Set of 24+ size Prismacolor, Lyra, Faber-Castell, or professional artist grade colored pencils; set of water color pencils (optional); kneaded eraser for lifting and/or a variety of erasers of your choice; pad or sheets of good quality paper, such as Bristol, Stonehenge, or Canson; ruler or straight edge; eraser shield (optional); electric eraser (optional); pencil sharpener (metal blade, not plastic), battery operated, electric, or hand-held; drawing board or support for paper; drafting tape or artist tape; soft drafting brush or non-used makeup brush; container to hold supplies and to protect pencils from breakage. *Since we have guest instructors, you may be asked to bring additional supplies.



April 3 - May 29 - CALLIGRAPHY taught by PENNY WHITE. In this fun and creative class you will learn the "Art of Beautiful Writing." Spring term you will continue learning about a script called Uncial. Uncial is the ancient majuscular book hand characterized by simple, rounded strokes. It apparently originated in the 2nd century AD when the codex form of book developed along with the growing use of parchment and vellum as writing surfaces. May 12, 26, June 2, 9, 23-BASIC DRAWING CLASS taught by KATHY HANEY. Think you can't draw? Want to improve your drawing skills? Would you like to sketch images as you travel? Do you want to Improve your painting, printmaking and sculpture skills? If so, this is the class for you. If you can write, you can draw. Drawing is the basic form of expression that we have used since caveman days. As children we drew images to share stories and ideas. We used simple symbols to represent the images and ideas. At some point, most people become frustrated that these symbols are limited and want to draw more lifelike images. Having already developed the necessary dexterity skills, the task is to learn to "see" in a more objective way. Learning to "see" is the focus of this class. This class will build on the skills you already have - even if you think you have none. You will learn various types of drawing: imaginary, gesture, contour, value and perspective drawings. We will use various drawing tools: graphite, charcoal, conte crayon, felt pen and pen and ink.

Supply List:

*a 9"x12" sketchbook

*a couple of pencils with a range of softness (B means soft and H means hard) a 4B 2B and 2H is fine to start with. Staedlers make a good set of drawing pencils.

*couple of erasers - art gum, kneaded and vinyl make a good selection

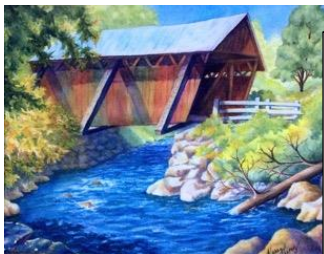
*a drawing board about 18" x 24" - a rigid piece of plexiglass, plywood, or foam core board will work. You can purchase a "gatorboard" that is like foam core board but is also water resistant so can be used for watercolor, too.

*an 18" metal ruler

*a hand pencil sharpener

*a fine point Sharpie and an ultra fine point Sharpie (permanent drawing kits at both Michaels and Craft Warehouse that include a variety of pencils, erasers, and sharpeners for a reasonable price.

May 17, 24, 31-PAINTING WATER in MOTION In Watercolor with Pen and Ink taught by KAREN BERG. Painting waterfalls, rivers and ocean scenes is exciting. Karen will show you how to use shape, size, line and color to create the movement of water. Along with these elements of design, rhythm, texture, proportion and value help to develop mood and unify compositions into a painting of water in motion. In this class you will study the movement of water, use warm and/or cool colors, mix "water" colors, work with washes to keep water "wet" and blurred.
