September, 2021 – "Colors of Autumn" Virtual Show




The judge of the Members' Showcase was Nancy Ericksen-Ward. Nancy is a KAA board member and teaches watercolor classes at KAA.



The Oregon Arts Commission, in partnership with the Ford Family Foundation, has created a new artist registry so artists can access funding opportunities.

Professional artists from across Oregon are encouraged to sign up for the registry by completing a brief survey about themselves and their artistic practice.

Eleanor Sandys, the Arts Commission's interim visual arts coordinator, said there are many working artists throughout Oregon who aren't in their database.

"Our hope is to update and expand our artist network so that we can better support the diverse artists in Oregon's many communities," she said in a prepared statement.

While the registry will remain open, artists are strongly encouraged to sign up by September 30th to establish a base registry.

KAA MEMBER SHARES ABOUT CREATING ART

Oh my, where do I begin; I was experimenting with some new products to use with my colored pencils on professional art paper that feels like fine grit sandpaper. One of the new products was to allow the colored pencils to go on like pastels by brushing on a white archival dry lubricant powder all over my scribbled colored pencils without the use of solvents. To my amazement, the product did exactly what it was supposed to do. I then had to add a textured spray fixative over the layer of pencils to hold down the colors so they would not continue to smear with each added layer of color. I became very frustrated at this point



because the spray fixative left splatters all over my project. As I continued to move along with my project, adding layers of colored pencils with the products mentioned above and hoping to cover up the splatters with no luck, I finally stopped and thought it's time to trash this project. Honestly, I was so frustrated at this point; the trash can seemed to be the only option for my artwork, until....

Let's continue with my thought process: I could not throw away my work yet so could I layer pastels over colored pencils? I dragged out my pastel pencils and started looking for pastel colors that would work with and go over the colored pencils that I had laid down. I started layering pastel pencils over the colored pencils. I was so freaking excited to see that I could layer pastel pencils over colored pencils and cover up the fixative splatters. With excitement at this point I moved forward with what I thought would be my trashed art project. I ended up covering the entire project with pastel pencils and using colored pencils to finish off the very fine details of the lily. I entered my finished artwork in the KAA art show and to my surprise I took Best of Show. I turned an almost trashed piece into a treasure so I will never hesitate to try something new if my first options fail. As I always say, "the artistic license to explore, make changes, and try new things is our true expression that will speak to each viewer." Thus, I encourage you all to try new things to give our fans something to marvel over.



Exploring Scratchboard Art

Instructor: Laura Singer Cost: \$50 (Includes all materials) Saturday, October 23, 2021, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Experience levels: All

Learn all about and try your hand at scratchboard in this one-day workshop. Scratchboard is a smooth, white clay board covered in a layer of black India ink. You draw by scratching or scraping away the ink to reveal the white underneath. It's like drawing, but in reverse. Add color with fast-drying scratchboard inks if you wish, then scratch again to reveal highlights. It's easy, and it's very fun! This workshop will cover how to select or prep your own scratchboard surface, what materials are handy to have and where to get them, different techniques for scratching, how to add color with ink, and how to seal your final scratchboard to protect it. All materials are provided by the instructor, including helpful handouts, a small scratchboard for practice, tools for scratching, and one 8×8 inch scratchboard for a finished piece. Instructor will have subject reference photos available to choose from, or bring your own inspiration. If you will be attending virtually, sign up early and provide your address so there is time to ship you the materials (free shipping).

We'll break for a half hour around noon, so bring your lunch.

Stippling Class

All levels of expertise welcome. Cost: \$50. Saturdays, September 25, October 2 and 9, 10 am to 12 noon.

Learn techniques needed to create dramatic drawings using a technique called "stippling". This method can be used to create strong values and interesting textures by varying the density and pattern of dots. The class will focus on understanding tools and materials, creating values and textures, choosing effective subjects and compositions and finishing and presenting your artwork. If you like working with black and white, this class will provide new opportunities for you to express yourself. There is a minimum of supplies for maximum success.

Choosing a subject: • Look for images that have a wide value range. • Avoid those with large dark areas unless you have a lot of time to kill. • A variety of textures helps keep the process interesting and the final work strong. • Value thumbnails help you check for strong compositions. Lines are not used at all – only implied with dots. Dots placed 1/4" apart will produce a light value, 1/8" apart gives a darker value, nearly touching gives a dark value, etc.

"Things We Hold Onto"

Instructor: Shagufta Mulla Beginner Poetry Workshop, Cost \$50 for two 3-hour sessions, Date TBA, 10 am to 1 pm

Have you ever wanted to try writing free verse poetry but didn't know where to start? Or do you enjoy journal writing or writing short memoir pieces and want to try something new? This workshop is accessible to anyone with the willingness to try and the curiosity to explore their mind in a completely supportive environment. In the first session we will read poems together that demonstrate common literary devices used in poetry like imagery, repetition, line breaks, alliteration, and assonance. I'll include prose poems (which don't have intentional line breaks so they look like a paragraph.) Then we will do writing exercises through guided prompts. There will be opportunities for participants to share what they wrote if they feel comfortable doing so.

ABCDEFGHI JKLMNOPQR STUVWXYZ ABCCEFSHQ JKZMNOPQR SJUVWXY3 For the second session, bring a meaningful object (or photos of it) to the workshop for your own reference and you'll explore writing about it, and yourself, through guided stream of consciousness writing (basically, writing your thoughts as they flow, like journal writing.) You'll take parts of what you wrote and arrange them into a poem. Everyone will have an opportunity to read their poem, or an excerpt, if they wish (not required.) During this session, we'll also spend time giving each other positive feedback and constructive criticism. If you want feedback and help with poems you wrote from the first session, bring them along. I will give clear and simple directions ahead of time on how to give feedback so don't worry if you've never done this before. If you're interested in submitting poems to literary journals, we can go over how that's done and how to write both a cover letter and a writer bio to submit with your work.
