Below are comments made by judge regarding each winning entry.



First Place: "Soar Long Freedom", alcohol inks, Dee Hendrix

"One angry bird, representing the strong emotions of many factions in our country at this time. The Bald Eagle remains strong, powerful and angry; you don't want to tangle with this guy. The use of alcohol inks gives us a vibrant practice that many artists avoid, but it is very effective in this piece, giving it a strong sense of presence. This bird is truly 'in your face'!!"



Second Place: "Old Glory-Flay Bangello", textile, Janna Curtis

"An iconic image that we all recognize, artfully composed using a technique that allows for the staggering of strips of fabric to create the waving movement of Old Glory. The flag is placed over a background of shades of blue; could those broken images be stones, showing that our flag and country have been over that rocky road, but we are still whole? The white string and buttons, representing the stars or states of our nation, truly become stars if you look at the field of blue and squint your eyes!!!"



Third Place: "America", mixed media, Jody Farley

"What first drew me into this image were the interesting colors, textures and images, but it took a while to make sense of it, so I lingered. An interesting comment on the state of our country: it's fractured, broken, swirling with discord and at the same time, taken as a whole it remains beautiful. We are America Strong. The use of mixed media lends itself to the variety of textures found in the piece, giving it added interest."

"Our iconic Bald Eagle, a symbol of strength and power, here, appears pensive; wondering which direction our country will turn. The photographic detail of the feathers is amazing, the lighting perfection. Even the background is miraculously in shades of red and blue. Truly an iconic photo of the American Spirit. The unusual posture of this bird evokes an entirely different emotion or feeling than what we usually associate with the Bald Eagle. The power and strength is there, but so is calmness and reflection, something that we all could take a lesson from."

ARTIST OF THE MONTH** Laura Singer



"I have always been fascinated by the natural world, never failing to be amazed at the smallest of delicate flowers or the curl of a single leaf. The order, precision, symmetry, and variety found in the flora and fauna of my native Oregon largely serves as inspiration for my art. I love to discover new details in butterflies, wildflowers, and birds wherever I go.

Stripping down a subject into black and white is both a challenge and an artistic joy. Wonderful relationships between elements of the subject become apparent when color is removed from the equation, and the contrasting values alone can convey a sense of mystery.

On the other hand, color can set a mood and provide an additional outlet for the creative joy I feel when I find a new subject that pleases me. From the subtle blue grays of the tufted titmouse to the vibrant hues of flowers, color speaks in a way that nothing else can.

Making art is to me both an exhilarating thrill and a meditative process. Whether rendered in color or in black and white, each piece I create is approached as an experiment in the medium of choice. I enjoy creating using many different media, including oil paint, watercolor, colored pencil, pen and ink, scratchboard, and photography. My background in graphic design drives me to approach art as a problem-solving exercise, using visuals to convey a message or an emotion that cannot be expressed with words alone."
