



Patricia Young introduced us to painting with oils without using solvents. She talked about walnut and other oils which can be used to thin oil paints and to clean brushes. She also showed us oil paints that can be thinned with water...that's right, no smelly chemicals! She demonstrated how she begins her paintings. The painting to the left, which she began that evening, is now finished....and lovely.

Show and tell followed Patricia's demonstration:

Gary Olsen-Hasek showed us how he can digitally manipulate an image of a piece of fruit to come up with a reworked image that is truly a work of art.

Julie Thoreson brought some unique colored pencil pieces. She showed two pieces worked on tile and one a piece of driftwood which showed us that straying from the norm can result in great art.

Karen Saleen shared a colored pencil piece done on colored paper. The effect was stunning and we learned about the techniques applied when using colored pencils.

Linda Flicker talked about a piece she is currently working on. This is another "painted with light" piece and she showed us the concept and inspiration for the piece. There will be a colored pencil flower featured in the piece.

Leland Gilsen shared a wonderful piece created with natural pigments. Leland created this piece with his fingertips in 30 minutes. He has indicated an interest in doing a demo for our May Monday Meetup.

Terry saw Carol Harris' drawing of a mariner on a map at our last meeting and decided to build a frame for the piece. The frame turned out beautifully and it really enhances the drawing in a period and rustic way. Terry also shared another frame he made for his sister Arlene. It is amazing how a frame can so enhance a work of art.

Maddy Clark brought in some pieces of art she created using a technique called "Acrylic Pouring". This technique involves pouring and manipulating paints to create designs not achievable with traditional tools like brushes. Maddy will be having a class in April and she assures us we will be creating beautiful works of art.

MARCH ARTIST OF THE MONTH – STEVE KLEIER



one create an interesting painting?"

Steve says:

"As I have been an artist for my entire professional career, one question keeps coming up in my efforts. That is: "What is the important quality of a successful painting?"

Originally my answers focused on the specific qualities like form and content, composition and color, and these are important to be sure. Over time my answer became more and more ambiguous until it has lost almost any practical application. The answer is "In order for a painting to succeed it must create interest." As far as I can tell that is the ultimate goal.

If a painting does not interest the viewer, it is unsuccessful for the obvious reason, that no one will look at it for very long. Like many answers, it poses more questions -- the most obvious being, "How

As I again try to answer this question with specifics, I am thwarted by the exceptions. If I answer that good drawing creates interest, well, yes, it does but there are countless mediocre drawings that I find interesting, and of course, children's art work. On the other side of the coin, I can find really well drawn pictures quite academic and so my interest is held for only a short time.

Composition is important, and I think makes a strong case for being the most important attribute of a painting. The meaningful arrangement of shapes on the page goes a long way toward holding our interest whether it is realist or abstract. Also, the color, value and edges assigned to these shapes play an important role.

But no one of these attributes trumps the others in creating interest. Maybe it is a combination of these in the right proportion to each other that makes a painting work, or one done to a virtuoso degree that will compel us. Years of focused practice can be a key to success. But I am sure there are exceptions to this as well.

My best answer for how to create an interesting picture is that it has to do with the quality of one's obsession and the force of one's will. For the artist to obsessively will themselves free of these expectations and rules so that the picture strikes us on a visceral level, and the viewer has no choice but to be compelled by it."
