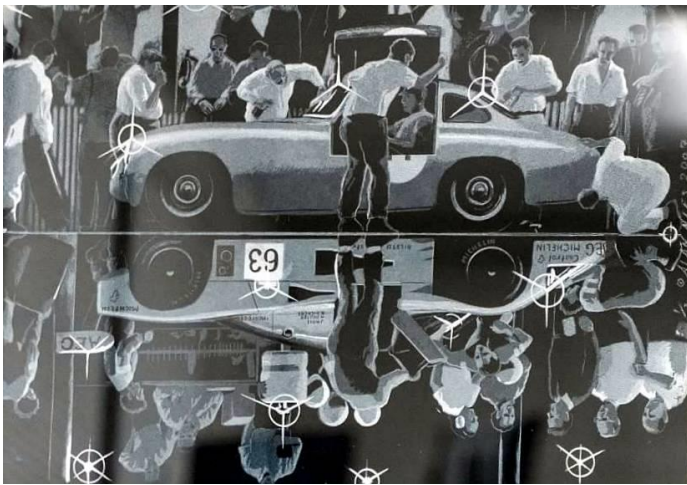

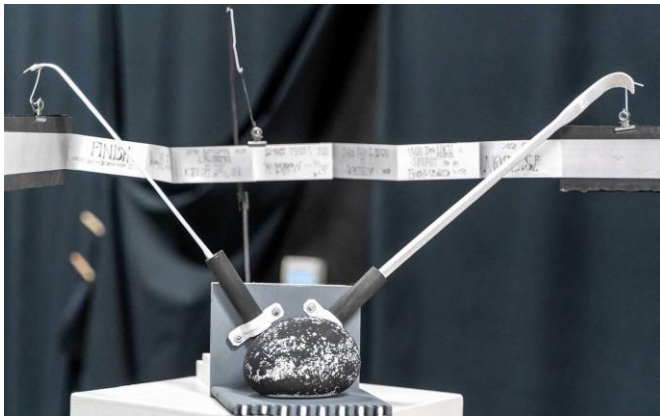

NOVEMBER ARTIST OF THE MONTH: RALPH OHM



Ralph Ohm has kept an interest in art ever since his mother gave him a set of oil paints when he was about 10 years old. However, the school art classes he attended while growing up were not very motivating for him so math and science pushed him toward the engineering sciences.

As a professional engineer, Ralph was involved in the design and construction of municipal water treatment plants, pipelines, dams, and tunnels.

But with all that, he has always had his paints and easel close by so he could capture in paint his experiences in the mountains, canyons, wildlife, farms and ranches of the West. Now that he is retired, he paints nearly every day. He paints both in his studio and outdoors using oils and acrylics.

Ralph has attended many art classes and workshops including the Jackson Hole Art Academy in Wyoming and the International Society of Artists in Salt Lake City, Utah. He has been an active member of several art guilds and is currently a member of the Keizer Art Association in Keizer, Oregon where he now lives.



WILLIAM C. BEALL, photographer

Faith and Confidence is a Pulitzer Prize-winning photograph from 1958 that was shot by William C. Bealls. It depicts a young boy and a policeman interacting during a Chinese New Year parade in Washington, DC. The photograph was incredibly popular, featured in *LIFE* Magazine and becoming the logo for the DC Boys Club. The picture was taken as Allan Weaver, who was two years old at the time, was trying to get closer to the colorful Chinese dragon and amazing fireworks of the parade.

At the time, Weaver's father was stationed in Japan. When Maurice Cullinane leaned down and told him to make sure he didn't get too close, Weaver asked if he was a marine. Maurice was relatively new to the police force and had joined because his father, grandfather, and two uncles had all served under it. In 1974, Cullinane became the chief of police. He retired the next year. Weaver went on to live a relatively normal life, moving to California and becoming Orson Welles's personal assistant before settling into his current occupation as a lighting consultant. Both Weaver and Cullinane have the picture hanging in their living rooms.

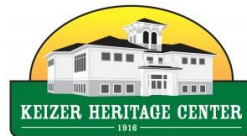
