This show is always such fun and well-received. Art must show some fins, feathers and/or fur. Art of any medium may be entered.


Children ages 4 to 14 are encouraged to enter this show.



"This triptic is a tropical foliage tribute to the island of Oahu. The prominent and enormous philodendron leaves provide movement with direction, undulating form, color and light. Even the red ti plants get into the act, but growing through the holes of the philodendron or waving in their delicate "arms". It is very nearly rhythmic and suggestive of a dance; the hula, maybe?"


Digital Art First Place: "Invoking the Holy Spirit", Jesus Escobar

The jewelry is presented in a marbled box with gold-colored metal feet. The palette of colors in the marbling on the box are similar to the colors in the jewelry adding to the overall presentation."

While in college, during the mid-eighties I took a couple of classes in acrylic painting. Within a year I moved on to oil painting and have never looked back.



Prior to retirement, there never seemed to be enough time available for art. My painting schedules were never consistent. Following retirement, my wife and I moved from Puyallup, Washington to Keizer, Oregon in 2019. I now try to paint several days each week unless life gets in the way.

Outside of the two acrylic classes early in life, my education in art is derived from reading and the internet. Youtube University has been a true friend. I have found many good sources of information over the years that have helped me refine my processes, techniques and composition.

Although there are no requirements for previous painting experience, this class is a continuation of our "Beginning Oil Painting" class. We will explain and stress safety precautions to avoid the harmful effects of solvents and paints with hazardous materials. 




