
Children ages 4 to 14 are encouraged to enter this show.



MOUNTAIN CABIN OIL PAINTING

Instructor: Don Ely Tuesday, March 4th, 1:30 to 4:30 pm Four-week workshop \$60



This workshop is comprised of four, three-hour sessions occurring on Tuesday afternoons. The classroom will be open beyond scheduled class time for student instruction, at your convenience. This class is tailored to those students who have previous experience in oil painting, however, students new to oils can be accommodated. We will be painting a mountain scene on an 11 x 14 canvas from start to finish. This will be a winter scene with snow covering the landscape with a rustic cabin overlooking a tranquil creek reflecting the setting sun. We will continue to paint with a minimum use of solvents emphasizing a healthy painting environment. Basic equipment and materials are provided with the exception of paper towels and an apron (if desired) however, you are encouraged to bring your own tabletop easel and supplies, if you have them.

Key topics address photography core concepts as well as knowledge of the digital camera and related equipment, including:



- -How each component works
- -Image impact from changing each component'
- -The interrelationship between the components

Using camera feedback mechanisms to determine appropriate image exposure

- -Metering modes, interpreting light meter readings
- -Histogram analysis
- -Setting exposure compensation

In addition classroom learning, participants will have the opportunity to practice what they've learned by photographing indoors/outdoors.

The fun part about painting is that once you know a few simple techniques, you can paint anything you can imagine. The hardest part is getting started with that big, blank canvas in front of you. That's where I come in. I will guide you through the painting step by step, however, I look forward to seeing the personal touches you add to your paintings! In this class we will learn about mixing colors to get the tones we want and how to work in layers to paint elements of the painting one at a time. Everyone can do this and I invite you to paint along, whether you have been painting for years or this is your first time trying.

For this class, the material fee includes all materials that will be needed for the class. We will be painting mushrooms on the forest floor. In this class we will learn about color blending and contrast. If you would like to add something different to your painting, please do! I think three hours will be enough time for the class, however, if you need more time, I will stay until the last painting is finished. A tabletop easel is optional, so if you would like to bring one, feel free

SCRATCHBOARD ART

Learn all about and try your hand at scratchboard in this one-day workshop. Scratchboard is a smooth, white clay board covered in a layer of black India ink. You draw by scratching or scraping away the ink to reveal the white underneath. It's like drawing, but in reverse. Add color with fast-drying inks if you wish, then scratch again to reveal highlights. It's easy and it's very fun!

This workshop will cover how to select or prep your own scratchboard surface, what materials are handy to have and where to get them, different techniques for scratching, how to add color with ink, and how to seal your final scratchboard to protect it. All materials are provided by the instructor and are yours to keep, including helpful handouts, a scratchboard for a finished piece. Instructor will have subject reference photos available to choose from, or bring your own inspiration (about 8 x 8 inches) No previous drawing experience is necessary.

We'll break for a half-hour around noon, so bring your lunch.
