




Best of Show: "Storm Over Drakenberg Mountains, South Africa", watercolor, Ginny Stevens

By removing the eroded rind from the cross, there was good carving stone underneath, sometimes a pure white marble. Carole repurposed that white marble into a beautiful female figurine that holds a large bouquet of lilies. Carole fielded lots of questions from our eager audience. Our agenda included announcements, show & tell, refreshments and conversation with talented artists.
